



THE BC EPILEPSY SOCIETY LAUNCHES DOCUMENTARY FOURTH EPISODE "JESUS LOVES ME: THE MACKENZIE MACWILLIAMS STORY"

Vancouver, BC – <u>JESUS LOVES ME: The Mackenzie MacWilliams Story</u> is the fourth episode of the BC Epilepsy Society's What If … Documentary Series[™].

The launch of the fourth episode follows the successful launches of their first episode, <u>FAILURE: The Black</u> <u>Mark on Canadian Health Care</u>, which now has over 49,000 views and can be viewed <u>here</u>; their second episode, <u>PRISONER OF PURGATORY: The Jared Ricks Story</u>, which now has over 43,000 views and can be viewed <u>here</u>; and their third episode, <u>UNASHAMED AND UNAFRAID: The Allison Hegedus Story</u>, which now has over 15,000 views and can be viewed <u>here</u>.

The What If ... Documentary Series[™] was born out of necessity to highlight the lack of action from the BC Provincial Government and includes the Society's unsuccessful efforts to meet with government over a period of 26 months. Kim Davidson, the CEO & Executive Director of the BC Epilepsy Society, and the Founder of the international I AM A VOICE for Epilepsy Awareness[™] campaign is the Creator and Producer of the What If ... Documentary Series[™].

The adult epilepsy crisis in British Columbia is ongoing and patients continue to die while waiting years for the treatment and care they need. The provincial government has still not taken any corrective action to build appropriate adult epilepsy infrastructure in British Columbia.

<u>On November 13th, 2020 at the 73rd World Health Assembly, the World Health Organization (WHO)</u> <u>determined that</u> neurological disorders, including epilepsy, are the leading cause of disability and the second leading cause of death worldwide.

<u>JESUS LOVES ME: The Mackenzie MacWilliams Story</u>, the fourth episode of the What If … Documentary Series[™] showcases the journey of Mackenzie MacWilliams, an accomplished young man from a tight-knit family and faith-based community in Delta, BC.

Mackenzie tragically passed away on April 25th, 2019 at the age of 27, leaving behind his infant son, wife, loving family and too many friends to count. His premature death was the result of Sudden Unexpected Death in Epilepsy (SUDEP).
